Learning within the Nursery School



We will be participating in the World Nursery Rhyme Week - week beginning 15th November 2021.

Did you know??? Experts in literacy and child development have discovered that if children know eight nursery rhymes by heart by the time they're four years old, they're usually among the best readers by the time they're eight.

Nursery Rhymes are fantastic for developing children's early language and reading skills which is why we focus on them at school and encourage you to practise them at home. Young children have the capacity to learn and retain an enormous amount of information and by hearing nursery rhymes over and over they easily learn them off by heart. By teaching children nursery rhymes, we will help them acquire the following skills.

Language Development

Nursery rhymes help your child learn new words. They are easy for young children to remember and repeat as there are lots of rhythm and repetition. They introduce a child to new ways of using their voice as they can be loud or quiet, fast or slow and use a variety of inflections.

Early Reading Skills

Nursery Rhymes help young children understand the structure of a story as most rhymes will have a clear beginning, middle and end. In Jack and Jill they go up the hill, fetch a pail of water and then it all goes wrong. This is a whole story in just a few lines. It is also an old nursery rhyme so it will introduce your child to words they may not have heard before—pail for bucket and crown for head. This will help your child understand that there is more than one word for the same thing.

Physical Development

Children love acting out their favourite rhymes and they offer great opportunities to get them moving. Movements in action rhymes and songs will help develop a child's fine and gross motor skills as well as balance, coordination. They will also be developing the skills required to follow simple instructions.

Numeracy

Many rhymes will help your child become familiar with numbers and counting. Rhymes such as 'One, Two, Three, Four, Five—Once I Caught A Fish Alive' will help your child remember the order of numbers. Other rhymes can introduce important mathematical concepts such as size and order.

The nursery rhymes being focused on during this year's world nursery rhyme week are:- Incy Wincy Spider, Sleeping Bunnies, Wind the Bobbin, Head, Shoulders, Knees & Toes and Down in the Jungle.

Absences

Please remember to get in touch with the school if your child is not going to be attending Nursery School. Unwell children



In the event of your child being ill, especially with a vomiting/diarrhoea bug, please do not send him/her to school. The Public Health Agency advises that 48 hours is left from the last episode of illness before your child returns to school. In addition, if your child is on an antibiotic they must not attend school until the course is completed.

Covid-19

If your child is showing any signs of Covid-19, please ensure your child does not attend school and either gets a PCR test or remains at home for 10 days. If your child has a PCR test and the result is negative then they can return to school. Please get in touch with the school to let us know what the result is.

The following main symptoms to look for are: -

- > new continuous cough and/or
- > high temperature
- loss of taste or smell

If symptoms start at the weekend or a test has been confirmed as positive at the weekend please email me to let me know as I will be checking my emails daily.

Child Protection

The safety of all our children is paramount to everything that we do. If you have any concerns about any child in the school please either request to speak with myself or write a letter to the Chairperson of the Board of Governors, Mrs Hanna c/o Ballymoney Nursery School. If I am unavailable, please speak with Mrs Muller (Deputy Designated Officer for Child Protection) or any member of staff who will relay your message on to me.
