Learning within the Nursery School



This month all of the children will continue exploring Autumn, discussing the importance of being safe and feeling safe. We will also be planting daffodil bulbs to help get our school garden ready for springtime as well as bringing some home (3) This month is also the launch of the world nursery rhyme week and all the classes will be focusing on nursery rhymes with particular emphasis on: - Wheels on the bus, Miss Polly had a dolly, five little speckled frogs, hickory dickory dock and Old MacDonald.

We will also begin practising our songs for our Christmas concerts. Unfortunately, due to the current situation we are unable to invite you in to watch your child's class perform, however the concerts will still take place and we are currently trying to find out the best way to share them with you.

Parental Partnership

Individual Parent/Carer consultations

Due to Covid-19 our parent/teacher consultations will take place by telephone. This will be a 10 minute telephone call to discuss how your child has settled into Ballymoney Nursery School. The phone calls for the morning classes will take place week beginning 9th November and the afternoon classes will take place the week beginning 16th November. If you would like a telephone call please phone the school this week (between 9am and 3.00pm) and arrange a suitable time for your call.

Emotional wellbeing

Respond: <u>Emotional well-being service</u> are funded by Department of Education and the aim of this service is to provide immediate support that children and young people need, to help them manage current challenges and prevent problems escalating to crisis level during the Covid pandemic.

Blended learning / Use of Seesaw

Part of our school development plan is to enhance parental involvement through the use of Seesaw, blended learning and the Getting ready to learn bags. Blended/home learning sheets will be issued at the beginning of every month along with the school newsletter. The activities can be used it a child needs to self-isolate, the entire class bubble needs to self- isolate for 14 days or if you want to reinforce the learning your child is doing at nursery.

Every child now has a Seesaw account and can upload photos of themselves carrying out some of the activities and staff will comment on them during school hours. Please note that for any communication with your child's class teacher we would ask you still to telephone the school to speak with them. In the event that your child's class are self-isolating for two weeks then your child's teacher can be contacted via Seesaw as they will not be in school.

As a staff team, we are all still learning how to use Seesaw and as we develop our skills we will make more effective use of it as the year progresses.

Important Information

Unwell children

Thank you to everyone who has been conscientious and cautious and kept their child home if they have been feeling 'under the weather'.

In the event of your child being ill, especially with a vomiting/diarrhoea bug, please do not send him/her to school. The Public Health Agency advises that 48 hours is left from the last episode of illness before your child returns to school. In addition, if your child is on an antibiotic they must not attend school until the course is completed.

Covid-19

If your child or anyone in your house is showing any signs of Covid-19, please ensure your child does not attend school for 14 days. The following main symptoms to look for are: -

- new continuous cough and/or
- > high temperature
- loss of taste or smell

Please let us know if your child is off school due to self-isolating. If symptoms start at the weekend or a test has been confirmed as positive at the weekend please email me to let me know as I will be checking my emails daily.

If you or anyone in your house is being tested for Covid-19 please inform us immediately and do NOT send your child to Nursery. If your child is already at nursery when you become aware a test for someone in your house is required, please contact us and pick your child up.

Face Coverings

Peter Weir, the Minister for Education gave an interview on Thursday 29th October 2020 when he said "I am asking parents and carers not to congregate at school gates when they are dropping off their children. Always practise social distancing and wear a mask...". Therefore, we are asking the adults who will dropping off and picking up children from the Nursery to now wear a face covering and to continue to socially distance when outside.

Pre School Admissions for 2020-21





Forms must be submitted by 12 noon on Thursday 29th January 2020. Due to the current restrictions, we will not be holding an open day however will be making a promotional video instead to give everyone an insight into life at Ballymoney Nursery School. We would like to have some children in the video so parents can see how children enjoy themselves here. A consent form will be sent home this week for you to opt in to give us permission to include your child in the video.

Children born on or between 2 July 2017 and 1 July 2018 are eligible to apply for admission to a funded pre-school place.

Children born on or between 2 July 2018 and 1 July 2019 are eligible to apply for admission to a penultimate (underage) place. These are allocated if there are still any funded places available after target age (pre school) children are admitted.

Please note, that all our current pre pre school children need to reapply to attend here for their pre school year.

Board of Governors


